

SCHOOL ELECTION - VOTER INFORMATION SHEET

<p>Can I register to vote?</p>	<p>Anyone wishing to register to vote MUST:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be a citizen of the United States • Be 18 years of age on or before the election day • Have resided in the county at least 30 days • Register at least 29 days prior to the election <p>You must re-register if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You move from one county to another • You have a name change due to marriage, divorce or Judgment of Court <p>To verify your registration status, contact the Middlesex County Commissioner of Registration.</p>
<p>How do I register?</p>	<p>Voter registration applications are available from the NJ Division of Elections, the Middlesex County Commissioner of Registration office, or the Woodbridge Municipal Clerk. Registration forms can also be found at many schools, state agencies, and Motor Vehicle offices. You can also access an application from the NJ Division of Election online (http://www.state.nj.us/lps/elections/vote_doe.html) and mail it to the Middlesex County Commissioner of Registration office. Fax copies or email copies are not acceptable so you will need to mail the voter registration form since an original signature is required. The registration deadline to vote in the April 18 School Board & Budget Election is March 28, 2006.</p>
<p>Where do I vote?</p>	<p>You must contact the Middlesex County Commissioner of Registration or the Woodbridge Municipal Clerk and they can provide you with that information.</p>
<p>I am going to be away for Spring Break and won't be around for the election - how can I get an absentee ballot?</p>	<p>If for any reason you will be absent or unable to get to the polling place on election day you can cast your vote by submitting an absentee ballot.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You do this by completing an Absentee Ballot application, which is available from the Middlesex County Clerk's Office. • You must be a registered voter. • Applications must be received no less than 7 days before the election. • You will not be permitted to vote at your polling place in the same election. • Your absentee Ballot must be received by the County Board of Elections before close of polls on Election Day (8:00pm). • You will receive instructions with your Ballot. • Do not submit more than one application for the same Election.
<p>I got an absentee ballot and my trip was canceled - what do I do now?</p>	<p>You may NOT vote at the polls if you received an absentee ballot, even if the circumstances that caused you to apply to vote absentee have changed. You must vote the absentee ballot. You can, however, drop off the completed ballot at the Middlesex County Board of Election office on Election Day.</p>
<p>I moved very recently and it's too late to register what do I do?</p>	<p>Any voter who has moved within a county, and has not corrected their voter records, is eligible to vote in their new municipality by provisional ballot at the polling place. To vote with this ballot, you need to complete an affirmation form.</p> <p>If you moved across county lines more than one month ago, you had to register in your new county of residence. You cannot vote in your old county.</p>
